#### **Lead ToD at Summerside PDC**

- Saying a sad farewell to Karishma who will be greatly missed but we wish her all the luck as she furthers her carer in a peri role in Brent.
- Nadia Campbell, an experienced Summerside teacher and speech and language therapist will be joining the PDC 5 days a week while training as a ToD on the Mary Hare course.
- I am continuing to lead the provision but am dropping back to 3 days a week, the other 2 days to be covered.
- One CSW continues to be long term sick and is being covered by agency staff
- PDC numbers remain around the 10 or 11 mark, Barnet have changed the funding structure and now only top up the number of children we actually have rather than giving us a set number of children we are resourced for so budgeting is challenging especially with variable numbers
- We are getting higher than usual numbers of Deaf children that do not have an EHCP and do not meet provision criteria in the mainstream. We are working closely with the Borough Peri team to manage this and include the mainstream children in morning audiology checks and where appropriate in our withdrawn sessions for specialist

teaching, deaf studies and mental health groups.

 Budgetary constraints mean that we are starting to be unable to financially support our Level 1 BSL courses so tough decisions may need to be made about their ongoing viability.

# Lisa York Newborn Hearing Screening

Our KPI for babies screened by 4 weeks in Q4 was 97.2% for Barnet, which was below target, however this was by current site, so includes the babies who are for outpatients. If we look at creating site i.e. babies born at Barnet we achieved 99.0%, which shows that it is the number of outpatients we are receiving from other sites that is having an impact on this.

The number of outpatients had improved since the three new part-time screeners started at Camden and Islington, however due to sickness/staffing issues across C&I they have remained significant and therefore this is still having an impact on Barnet babies.

We still have a part-time band 3 screening post to advertise for Barnet and hope to do this soon but posts in other hospitals have become more of a priority. It is having very little impact on our inpatient screening.

27/27 babies who required an immediate referral to audiology, were offered an appointment within the required timescales (standard 4), which means that we met the acceptable level and achievable level, we achieved 100%.

There were 26/27 babies who required an immediate referral and who were brought for an audiological assessment appointment in the required timescale. (NH2), so again we met the acceptable and the achievable level, we achieved 96.3%. The one baby who was not seen in the required timescale was due to family not attending 2 appointments, they attended on the third appointment.

	We are still in the process of developing and updating our SOP's across NCL, especially for our outpatients, with a view to improving the way that we appoint and improve the attendance at clinics.
